These same systems, however, diminish greatly in size, power, authority, and importance once we see them from a Kingdom of God perspective. The Kingdom of God is simply bigger than they. Have these systems grown smaller? Not particularly! They were always diminished. It has always been a matter of perception. They have not grown smaller. We have grown taller. Our confidence in God and His crowned authority upon His sons has increased in us as well.

Now, the more we see how much authority we have as "responsible" sons in the Kingdom, the more our faith increases. It will no longer be a matter of hoping, straining to believe, or faking faith.
